Crisis Response Training

This month several CMSD staff participated in Crisis Response Training delivered by Bruce Ramsay, a Certified Traumatologist with Vancouver-based Trauma Serve. The training served to increase the school district's ability to effectively support critical incidents that occur within our school communities, including supporting those adults who themselves are often leading the incident response at the school. The learning sessions addressed the core elements of a comprehensive crisis intervention curriculum, and participants developed their understanding of and skills in stress management and incident debriefing. Thanks to Director Julia Nieckarz and the Learner Support team for their leadership with this important learning opportunity.
